Regular Meeting - July 2, 2024

- I. CALL TO ORDER: The Regular Meeting of the Weaverville Fire Protection District was called to order by Board Chairman Bill Fischer at 1005 hours.  - iv. The OES salary survey has been completed and he has also signed the Cal Fire local agreement
 - v. He helped with the LaGrange Bike Race, which will be talked about more in the Department report as multiple members helped with standby
